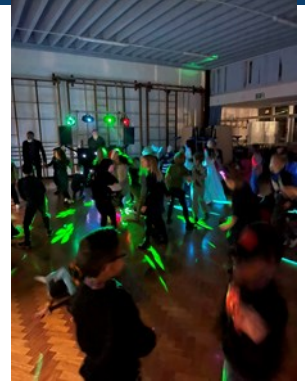


# Rockliffe Manor News

Year 2 enjoyed their trip to the local church this week and learned some interesting facts about Christian beliefs. The children displayed our value of respect and listened intently, also showing our character skill of wonder and asking questions. They know how important it is to respect other people's beliefs and be kind to everyone.

In Year 6 this week, the children have really been getting to grips with computing and the children were able to articulate computational language and build a basic program on the iPads. They have also been researching various humanitarian charities which are providing aid in the Congo, which then lead to them designing their own charity campaign. As well as this, in maths they have begun tackling fraction problems and sequencing events in English; they are really enjoying their new core text, Trash.
