Thank you to all the parents who came to our parent stay and learn science session this week. It was great to have you in the classrooms and experiencing a science lesson alongside the children. The children really do love having you in school and we hope it gives you an insight into what we do and how we teach different subject areas. Science is a firm favourite with the children and they especially enjoy the practical investigations. Please do ask your children what they are learning in science and see if they can tell you some of the core knowledge and vocabulary of their topics.





This week, Year 3 have been exploring a range of

poetry, considering styles, devices, features and different types of poems! They have considered word choice impact on the reader, as well as learning about the structure and features of a Haiku poem. They immersed themselves in some poetry performances and gave each other some peer feedback based on this.

Year 3 have also been considering the real life uses of magnets in science including how they work in a roller coaster, train and fridges. They gathered

as many real life examples as possible and discussed how not all metals are magnetic: just certain types of metal.

"I was shocked when I realised that different metals have different magnetism, this is why not all magnets work on all metals. I enjoyed this lesson a lot." Liya

The Nursery children have continued to explore plants and biodiversity, learning about the different parts of a plant and how to grow their own beans. They used a bubble map and learned a song to remember the names of plant parts and talked about what they would like to put in their own gardens: 'Red flowers...a butterfly', said Ollie. 'I would plant a beautiful flower!' (Ellee), 'Rainbow flowers!' (Ethan),

'Yellow flowers' (Freya).

The children also used seeds to practise counting objects one by one and have





loved playing outdoors with their new mud kitchen and car ramp (kindly donated by Ethan's mum!

On Thursday 3rd February 2022, the borough will be celebrating 10 years of being a Royal Borough. To celebrate their royal history month they will be organising a range of events open to all. They will also be sharing some exciting announcements ahead of HM The Queen's Platinum Jubliee. Be sure to check <u>RBG's website</u> and social media for updates.

Greenwich certainly deserves the honour, at least from an historical perspective. Three monarchs — Henry VIII, Mary I and Elizabeth I — were born at the palace of Placentia, the long-demolished royal residence formerly on the site of today's Old Royal Naval College. Only St James's Palace can boast more Crown births. In addition, boy king Edward VI died at Placentia, and two of Henry VIII's marriages took place there.



Then there are, or were, many other 'Royal' buildings around the borough: the Royal Observatory part of the <u>Royal Museums Greenwich</u>, the Royal Artillery, Dockyards and Arsenal downriver at Woolwich, and the Queen Elizabeth Hospital on the slopes of Shooters Hill.

### The changes you need to know

From Thursday 27th January, the majority of COVID-19 restrictions in England have been eased.

#### It will still be compulsory to self-isolate if you test positive for COVID-19.

#### The risk of COVID-19 has not disappeared completely. You can still catch and spread the virus.

If you have COVID-19 symptoms, <u>get a PCR test as soon as possible.</u> Stay at home until you get your test result – only leave your home to have a test.



If you are symptomless but test positive on a rapid lateral flow, selfisolate immediately to stop the virus spreading.

Self-isolation in England has been reduced to a minimum of five full days.

People with COVID-19 in England can end their self-isolation after 5 full days, as long as they test negative on day 5 and day 6 (where day zero of the isolation period is when you first show symptoms or, if you do not have symptoms, the day you took your test).

If you are unvaccinated and come into close contact with a positive case, you are still required to selfisolate for 10 days.

Additionally from 27th January the Government will remove mandatory mask wearing, but you're still encouraged to wear a mask in crowded indoor settings.

In general, the risk of catching COVID-19 is higher in crowded, enclosed spaces.

It will still be compulsory to wear masks on TfL services, such as buses, the DLR and tubes. This will reduce the virus spreading again.

The virus spreads through the air, and if a setting is poorly ventilated, it isn't blown away quickly. That's why wearing masks is an easy, effective thing to do.

Working from home guidance is no longer a government requirement. <u>Find out more about returning to</u> work. Beachwood welcomes children in the morning before school and afterwards until 6pm. We have sixteen places available for pupils in Reception to Year 6 and who attend Rockliffe Manor.

#### Beachwood opening times are:

- 7.30am to 8.45am Morning sessions

We offer breakfast in the morning and a snack in the evening, and there are two staff members on site at every session. Beachwood is a registered play setting and is run in line with Ofsted regulations. The staff provide planned activities including a movie night on a Wednesday, a cooking night and help with homework.

All places are offered on a full time basis at a cost of **£75.00** per child per week. Fees are payable in ParentPay.
