The children and teachers were all excited to showcase their individuality by conquering the 'Catwalk of Confidence' in assembly. It was so great to see the level of confidence and support in both the children and the adults in the school. Ivan in Year 6 has been asking to do the cat-

walk every day since because he loved it so much. After celebrating together in the morning, the classes went away and widened their knowledge and understanding of afro hair. In Year 6, Reagan was amazed to find out that slaves used cornrows to communicate and to also create maps of the railways as escape routes. Across other year groups, children learnt how to draw afro hair from a tutorial video and created some amazing outcomes! In Year 5, the children created some amazing poems about afro hair. 




In 2022, Her Majesty The Queen will become the first British Monarch to celebrate a Platinum Jubilee, seventy years of service, having acceded to the throne on 6th February 1952 when Her Majesty was 25 years old.

As part of the year long celebrations everyone in the country has been given an extended bank holiday, from Thursday 2nd to Sunday 5th June, providing an opportunity for communities and people throughout the United Kingdom to come together to celebrate the historic milestone.

The government has instructed that as the Bank Holiday date of Friday 3rd June 2022 falls within the May half term, all schools will be required to claim the extra bank holiday day at a date of their choice during this academic year.

School Dinner Financials


Please may we respectfully remind all parents that you should never accumulate arrears in your School Dinner balance.
