Friday 17th June 2022

This week saw the start of Arts Fortnight across Rockliffe Manor and the children are really enjoying immersing themselves in art, creative writing, dance and music. Each year group has a focus art genre, for example, Year 1 are focusing on Surrealism, Year 2 are exploring Cubism and Year 3 have Art Deco. Each afternoon for 2 weeks will be spent exploring these art genres and the children can't wait to share their learning with you in their showcases.





Reception have really enjoyed exploring the artist Andy Warhol and his fabulous work around pop art. To support their learning, the children have observed a range of pop art images, with a focus around superheroes and comic books. The children then explored a variety of pop art techniques such as printing, layering and ben day dots to select what technique they would prefer to use for their art published outcomes.

Samuel said 'I love the comic book superheroes, I will make a pop art Spiderman'.

Freddie said 'I used the onomatopoeia bang and boom, I then used what I learnt

in pop art to make my words 3-D'.

In their literacy learning, the Reception children have continued with the theme of pop art and have used the knowledge they have gained to create superhero onomatopoeia posters!

Rose said 'I love pop art, I want Ben Day dots all over my work'.



Aniya said 'The dots and stripes really make the art stand out.'

Year 6 had a wonderful time going into London this week. They took the new Elizabeth line to the West End to watch the musical, Matilda.

For many of the children, this was the first time visiting a theatre and so it was a special experience. They were very happy to discover that they had front performance and came row seats! The Year 6's were inspired by the back buzzing about their own production of Matilda. They were impressed

by the skills of the child actors and are now thinking

about their own parts.

The Year 2 children have been fully immersed in their art learning. They have had a great week researching cubist artists and generating questions that they wonder about this type of abstract art. Jawad asked a very thoughtful question, "Who inspired Pablo Picasso and George Braques to create art from different angles?" Cassidy on the other had said, "I think Pablo Picasso was inspired by his country Spain to create bright and vivid art because in Spain the weather is very sunny and hot." The children have been developing a range of art skills to including colour theory and shading techniques for a textured effect and they are very excited to be continuing their art journey for another week. In addition, the children have also been using the enquiry skills of comparative testing to investigate the best conditions for germination. Year 5 have also been really enjoying Arts Fortnight. They have been exploring their topic of Fauvism through a wide range of mediums including technology, painting and observational drawing in the nature garden. Each child has selected their Henri Matisse art piece to inspire their final outcome and have discussed what they particularly like about it.











howling wind.' All of the children are excited to continue working towards their final outcomes next week and can't wait to show their family and friends during the showcase
