lockdown. Haiku is a type of short form poetry originally from Japan



and consists of three phrases in a 5 7 5 syllable pattern. Here is an example from Year 5:

This week, Year 4 have had an exciting week in their maths learning. After finishing their learning on rounding and ordering numbers, Year 4 began to explore Roman numerals and how they may be similar/different to the way we write and use numbers today. In history, Year 4 explored the term democracy and how the ancient Greeks were the founding fathers of the system that we use today. Following their ancient Greek learning, the children took part in an exciting debate, arguing for and against the big question 'Should children wear school uniform?'. They looked at the oracy strands from our framework, Physical and Linguistic, to help them successfully present their argument and in the end had the option to switch sides, based on the points made.

This week, Year 1 have begun using part part whole models in maths. The

children learnt what it meant to partition a number, Emre explained to his peers 'partitioning is when you split the number'. The class focused on identifying the two parts and began to understand that when added together they created the whole again. Izzy D was so excited when she realised 'the whole was 5, one part was 3, one part was 2, so that means 3 add 2 makes 5!'. Year 1 worked collaboratively to partition cubes and see what number bonds they could find. Anayah said 'I know that 4 add 5 makes 9' and Ella added '3 and 6 also make 9'. The children have started their addition learning with a bang and are excited to continue to expand their knowledge.

Thank you to everyone who donated food to our Harvest Festival

celebrations. All of this food will be delivered to the Greenwich Food Bank next week and will surely help many people. We will still be collecting items until the morning of Monday 11<sup>th</sup> so do bring any last minute donations to the hall. It is very important to us that we

talk to the children about kindness and helping others, and we have been talking about where the food will go during assemblies.

This week in assembly the theme of kindness also continued with our anti-bullying week presentation. The children all made a pledge and said 'I'm putting my hand up and pledging to put an end to bullying' Year went back to class and explored the
