### Friday 15th October 2021

We love reading! This week, we were excited to welcome parents back into the classrooms for our three weekly parent reading mornings. These will be every Thursday in Nursery and Reception. It is important to us as a school that children are encouraged to

read for pleasure, talk about books and hear adults read aloud. Reading aloud to children means that we are modelling key reading skills such as using expression and that children are hearing new language and vocabulary. We are also keen that children are listening to a wide range of stories, poetry and rhymes.



Year 5 went live with author and poet, Joseph Coelho, for the Book Trust Black History event. The children loved the session and felt in-

spired to write their own poems and learnt what an abecedarius poem is.

On Tuesday, the children took part in a We Are Rockliffe carousel afternoon focused on equality, diversity and inclusion. Each teacher created an activity in their classroom and the children visited different teachers to take part. Miss Roper did an activity around overcoming challenges and fairness, Year 1 learnt the definitions around EDI and Miss Gallagher celebrated similarities and differences with the children.

It's been a great and varied week in Year 6, the children have enjoyed

making an anti-bullying video which is now available on the @Rockliffemanor Twitter feed. Last Friday, they had special visitors in to help create lavish prints based on climate



for the Young London Print Prize. Year 6 have already started to bring in some of their homework dioramas; check out Elsie's jungle which had a flowing river through it. On Tuesday afternoon, the children got the chance to visit other classes to learn about the different aspects of inclusion and diversity at Rockliffe and beyond. Finally, they have had two visits from secondary schools in

the area and the children were very keen to ask lots of questions about secondary life.

This week, Nursery have been enjoying exploring cornflour and it's properties. They used a range of vocabulary to describe how they handled it. Ellee explained that '*it changes when you touch it*.' Albie asked '*what happens if you poke it?*' We then learned about germs and the importance of washing our hands. 'We don't want to eat dirt,' said Freya. In maths, the children have been exploring shapes and their properties, learning the names of 2D shapes, and counting sides and corners. We are very proud at how well the Nursery are settling into school!

This week, Year 3 have been doing art in the style of the Stone Age. The people who lived during this time period did not have the technology we have today so they used plants, charcoal and blood! Year 3 recreated this by using natural sources only.
