It was also lovely to welcome many of you into the classrooms for the first time in a long time for our Meet the Teacher sessions. This was a chance for the teachers to share important information with you and for you to ask any questions and get to know each other better. We hope you enjoyed the sessions and if you couldn't make it, please do let us know if you would like to arrange

another meeting with your child's class teacher. We will also make the presentations available to you.

This week, Year 1 have had an exciting week of learning. On Monday, Year 1 became investigators after finding a crashed spaceship in the nature garden. They used their inference skills to come up with predictions, Reggie H predicted 'I think it may have been a crocodile because we're right by the pond'. By the spaceship, Year 1 also



saw yellow footprints, Jacob didn't think these were a reliable clue and instead thought 'that a colourful



alien landed but the footprints have been sun bleached as it's so sunny!'. On Tuesday, they finally found out who the spaceship belonged to, it was the friendly alien Beegu and they can't wait to continue to explore her and her journeys on Earth.

Year 1 have also been exploring in art. They learnt about primary and secondary colours and used this knowledge to create a colour wheel. The class made sure they took their time, carefully painting each

section. When Ayomide had finished his primary colours, with a big smile said 'time for the secondary colours, first I am going to make green!'. Year 1 loved experimenting with the mixing of the colours and Holly proudly shared with the class 'I made purple paint, I used blue and red!'

Year 1 have settled so well into the new school year and all the adults are so proud of their enthusiasm and curiosity.

This week, Year 4 began to delve deep into the world of ancient Greece as they explored their

core text 'The Adventures of Odysseus'. They identified the features of a mythical story and explored the characters through role play and freeze frames. They have been able to create links between characters and begin to form a bank of descriptive vocabulary that they will use to tell their own Greek myth. Year 4 have also been great scientists this week through their

science experiment as they explored states of matter. Using a range of their favourite fizzy drinks, they created predictions based on whether or not they thought gas was weightless the results shocked them all!

Mason – 'I really liked our science experiment



because I had to shake the fizzy drink really fast to try and make the bubbles disappear. When I shook the bottle with 7up, I was surprised because it had a lot of bubbles and I thought the Coke bottle would have more.'

Eslem – 'I really like learning about the ancient Greek Gods and Goddesses. I've learned that ancient Greeks believed in many mythical creatures like the scary Cyclops. I also know that none of them actually existed because myths are fictional stories.'

Lucia – 'I've enjoyed acting out and pretending to be the Greek Goddess Aphrodite. She is the Goddess of love and beauty and I had to speak very softly and be very gentle to try and show how I think she may have acted.'

Hani – 'I like the book we are reading because it has a lot of action in it. I can not guess what is going to happen next because it always surprises me. There are also loads of adventures in one book, so when you think one adventure is finished Odysseus goes straight into another one.'
