wonderful winter break and were able to spend some quality time with friends and family. The children have returned to school excited to start their new texts and topics and we are all looking forward to the signs of spring appearing during this term.

It's been a great start back in Year 6. The children have been really engaged with their new core text – No Ballet Shoes in Syria – the children have been asking lots of questions about it and its pertinent issues. This then led them to locating Syria on the map and they have been discussing other refugee journeys throughout history. The children have al-





so started their new science topic on light; in lesson one, they represented how the human eye interprets light into images to their peers. In art, Year 6 are creating a mood board of different Islamic patterns. They really like the form and symmetry of these and are already excited about creating their final outcome.

Max – "I liked trying different methods to get the same answer when converting metric measures in maths this week."

Samuel – "I was very pleased when I thought that Benin was something to do with Nigeria, and I was right – it is in the same spot where Nigeria is now"

This week has been a great week for Year 5, they have kicked off the week with their intense swimming lessons and have been doing very well. Already they have all made excellent progress so we can't wait to see their progression nearer to the end of the course. Isaac showed amazing resilience and the instructor





was very impressed because he never gave up when faced with a challenge and Ruby was very proud of herself as she overcame her fears 'lots of times' The children have also been showing the value of responsibility as they immersed themselves into their new topics across the curriculum. In geography, they were reading coordinates through a game of battleships, which they will use next week to identify geographical locations on maps. Year 5 'loved it because it was fun' and wanted to 'play this again,' some of the children even offered to bring in their own board game versions. Not only that, there has also been a lot of reflecting in English as the children have been showing em-

pathy for the Grenfell Tower victims. Eniola said 'If I were in this situation, I imagine I would feel heartbroken because people have died and lost houses because of the fire. I will also feel scared.' Cienna said she would feel 'melancholy because there would be things I wouldn't want to see and I wouldn't want to feel and I think other people would be shocked to be in that horrible situation of pain and suffering.'

We wonder what other amazing things they will learn next week!

Beachwood welcomes children in the morning before school and afterwards until 6pm. We have sixteen places available for pupils in Reception to Year 6 and who attend Rockliffe Manor.

#### Beachwood opening times are:

- 7.30am to 8.45am Morning sessions
- 3.30pm to 6.00pm After school sessions

We offer breakfast in the morning and a snack in the evening, and there are two staff members on site at every session. Beachwood is a registered play setting and is run in line with Ofsted regulations. The staff provide planned activities including a movie night on a Wednesday, a cooking night and help with homework.

All places are offered on a full time basis at a cost of £75.00 per child per week. Fees are payable in ParentPay.

Information on the changes to the self-isolation period for individuals who test positive for COVID-19

Since Wednesday 22 December, the 10 day self-isolation period for people who record a positive PCR test result for COVID-19 has been reduced to 7 days in most circumstances, unless you cannot test for any reason.

Individuals may now take LFD tests on day 6 and day 7 of their self-isolation period. Those who receive two negative test results are no longer required to complete 10 full days of self-isolation. The first test must be taken no earlier than day 6 of the self-isolation period and tests must be taken 24 hours apart. This also applies to children under 5, with LFD testing at parental or guardian discretion. If both these test results are negative, and you do not have a high temperature, you may end your self-isolation after the second negative test result and return to your education setting from day 8.

Health and social care workers, including those working in education settings, should follow guidance for their sector on taking LFD tests on day 8, 9 and 10. For more information, visit

Anyone who is unable to take LFD tests will need to complete the full 10 day period of self-isolation. Further information is available in the

### Daily testing for close contacts of COVID-19

People who are fully vaccinated, or children and young people aged between 5 and 18 years and 6 months, identified as a close contact of someone with COVID-19, should take an LFD test every day for seven days and continue to attend their setting as normal, unless they have a positive test result or develop symptoms at any time.

Children under 5 are not being advised to take part in daily testing of close contacts. If a child under 5 is a contact of a confirmed case, they are not required to self-isolate and should not start daily testing. If they live in the same household as someone with COVID-19 they should limit their contact with anyone who is at higher risk of severe illness if infected with COVID-19, and arrange to take a PCR test as soon as possible. They can continue to attend an education or childcare setting while waiting for the PCR result. If the test is positive, they should follow the

stay at home: guidance for households with possible or confirmed COVID-19 infection.

The situation is evolving and public health guidance can change at short notice. We will share any further updates with you as soon as possible.
