At the beginning of the week, Rockliffe Manor hosted our first in-person Challenge Partner review in 2 years, and are glad to say that we achieved leading status! The 3 day review meant that we were visited by 3 external reviewers from schools across the UK who observed lessons, looked at books and spoke to children and staff. The lead reviewer said that we are a small school with a big heart and they were so impressed by



how well the children were able to articulate their learning. The reviewers also commented on the high quality writing outcomes and how our curriculum effectively weaves knowledge, skills and values. We will be receiving our report in the next few weeks and are excited to share it with you!

This week, Year 1 have been researchers within their history lessons. They used QR codes and articles to find out interesting facts regarding leisure activities from the past. They focused on dancing, cinema and swimming and gathered many facts. Holly said 'Did you know that people used to go to the cinema to watch the news?' to which the whole of Year 1 were very confused about, Akoma said 'but we just watch the

news in our living room?' which opened up an interesting conversation about electronics within households. Year 1 were also surprised to find out that films used to have no sound but instead were accompanied by

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an orchestra. Reggie H made the connection to our school trip last half term 'we listened to an orchestra they would have played music for movies!'. The children watched videos of children dancing around a maypole and Izzy exclaimed 'that looks like so much fun, I wish we could do that!'. The children worked so hard and are very excited to pass on their new found facts in their upcoming sharing assembly this half term.



There have been some very exciting learning opportunities across the school and you can see lots of photos on our Twitter page @RockliffeManor. Year 3, as part of their measure unit in maths, got out onto the playground to explore perimeter. They counted steps to measure around the outside of buildings and shapes. Year 6 have loved their Sandbox augmented reality project and have loved building virtual worlds on iPads. The Year 6 children have also enjoyed visiting Year 2 and coaching the younger children in their maths learning on fractions. The older chil-

dren showed kindness and were excellent in extending Year 2's knowledge and skills.

This week, Year 4 have worked really hard in their learning. In English they enjoyed a senses lesson where they used their 5 senses to explore a setting of a Pakistani wedding. They tasted fruit, smelt incense and listened to Bhangra music, developing vocabulary to help them with their setting descriptions. In maths, the children finished their topic on area and perimeter and took part in a fun revision lesson on Roman Numerals playing walkabout bingo. In geography, they used maps and atlases to find countries that were part of the Silk Road trade route. They are really excited to start their learning on Pompeii and volcanoes.
