Reception have all enjoyed learning about the concept of capacity and volume. To support their learning, they have been using water with different colours to fill a variety of containers. The children then had a go at identifying the volume of liquid that was in each container, saying which was empty, half full and full. Mr Harracksingh made lots of mistakes and the children had to use their developing knowledge to spot the errors and help him to pour the correct amounts of liquid into the containers. During this activity, the children had the opportunity to develop their growing mathematical language using words such as, capacity, volume, amount, full, half full and empty.

David said 'That's not full, if it is full the container will not be able to hold any more liquid and it will pour out'.

Mateus said 'This is how you make the container half full; you stop at the middle and check'.

Lila said 'It is full because the liquid is filled to the top, the container cannot take any more liquid'.

Uliana said 'This container can hold more liquid than this container because it is much bigger'.

We are very excited to announce that our school has moved our student information system to Arbor.








Arbor also offers access to many training resources which are completely free for parents - including how to log in, how to book trips and pay for items such as dinner and extended provision.
