the year and to welcome your feedback on these. We really do appreciate any parent voice to ensure we are doing the very best for the children at Rockliffe Manor.

Let's take a look at some of the learning this week... This week reception have settled in very well at Rockliffe. They have been fully immersed in the learning environment engaging with all of the provision that has been provided for them. During carpet sessions this week, they have been looking at initial sounds in phonics and have practised writing their names. During the afternoons, the children have been identifying their emotions and sharing with each other how they have felt about their time at Rockliffe so far! Kairo said that he was feeling happy and really enjoys playing with his friends outside. Gioia was feeling loved because her mummy gave her a love heart before the school day and Malachi was feeling proud because he was sitting beautifully on the carpet. All of reception should be very proud as they complete their first full week of school. We can't wait to see all of the amazing things

they get to do this year.

This week Year 2 have been focusing on partitioning numbers in their maths. They have been using physical resources to represent how a number can be broken down into different combinations to maintain the same total. They were also very successful within their science lesson, identifying and reasoning what makes a living thing alive. The children were very excited to share their ideas and what they believe makes a thing alive and why it is so important to have these characteristics.

Year 4 have had a very busy and exciting week too! On Wednesday, they welcomed Welling United to kick start our 10-week programme on Wellness Wings. The children completed a questionnaire that assessed their understanding of what wellbeing and health means. This will then be repeated at the end of the programme to show the learning the children have done. The loved playing a game of sit-down balloon volleyball where the rules got harder every round. Cairon said 'It is so challenging not standing up to get the balloon but it is so much fun!'. The children also showed amazing teamwork skills by praising each other and communicating to pass the balloon.

Julie said 'Ava, that was an amazing shot!'.

Year 4 have also been immersed in their English learning this week, they have enjoyed reenacting the scenes from the book using key vocabulary to support them. Asante declared to the rest of the class 'it was not nobody who hurt you, you fool, it was I Odysseus'. The class have also been using the book's vocabulary in their writing such as Liya's sentence ``I felt dumbfounded when I read Circe had changed Odysseus' men into pigs.

The children have settled into Year 4 so well and have already begun creating such amazing outcomes. We look forward to seeing how the rest of the term develops.

We are pleased to inform you that the negotiation of a new contract with our current school meal suppliers, Chartwells, has meant that we are able to reduce the cost of a school dinner to £2.10 per day (£10.50 a week) from September 2022.

Rockliffe Manor School has its own kitchen and meals are prepared daily by our wonderful chef Gail. There is a choice of meat or vegetarian main dish, salad and dessert with water available throughout meal times. You will find the current menu until October 2022 attached.

#### Free School Meals

Children in years Reception to Year 2 are all entitled to free school meals as part of the universal meal scheme funded by the Government.

Free school meals are available to children from Years 3-6 whose parents are in receipt of eligible benefits including:

- Universal Credit with an annual net earned income of no more than £7,400.
- Child Tax Credit (with no Working Tax Credit) with an annual income of no more than £16,190, as assessed by HMRC.
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999.

If you think you are entitled to Free School Meals, please go to <a href="https://www.royalgreenwich.gov.uk/">https://www.royalgreenwich.gov.uk/</a> freeschoolmeals if the application is successful, please do let the school know as soon as possible so we may make the necessary arrangements. If you have any problems accessing the online application, please contact the school office.

Finally, please may we remind you, for administrative purposes, that we ask you to make the choice for school dinner or packed lunch on a termly basis and keep the school office informed of any changes.
