The first week of term in September is one of our favourite times of the year! It has been wonderful seeing all of the children settle straight into their new classes and there has been a buzz around school as the children see their friends. It feels like we have never been away! This September has seen us welcome some new families to our Rockliffe Manor community too, whether in Nursery, Reception or further up the school, we hope our new children and families feel the warmth of the Rockliffe Manor family.





As a school community we have spent the last week exploring our school values and re-visiting what they mean to us and how we model them in all aspects of our lives. At the beginning of the week, we held our first assembly of the year, within this we explored that our experience of having new shoes can help us to understand how we feel at times of change. On the positive side, shiny new shoes can make us feel proud. The downside is that at first new shoes can feel strange and uncomfortable. Before long the new shoes become as comfortable as the old ones! We likened this to the children's feelings at the start of a new term. They may feel uncomfortable, worried or nervous, but that feeling will pass.

With that said, the children have settled back into their new year groups extremely well and jumped straight into their learning with enthusiasm. All of the staff are very proud of them. This week Nursery have enjoyed meeting their new teachers and peers. To support the transition, they have been playing a variety of ice breakers and turn taking games to learn each other's names. The children have really enjoyed their week and have continued to grow in confidence as the week has developed. The children have also taken on a variety of responsibilities around the classroom



demonstrating our character skill Integrity as they have taken ownership for their learning environment, showing how we can care for and look after our class. This is what some of our nursery children had to say ...

Let's take a look at what year 3 have been up to this week. The children have also been building relationships with each other and their teachers by a range of different activities and team building games such as 'How are we connected?' where a piece of string showed how they were all connected to each other in some way.





They have also had their first ever French lesson, where they discovered all the different languages they already had in the class, as well as exploring French culture, customs and Geography. The children in year 3 also had their first ever Ukelele lesson, where they showed patience, a growth mindset and effort! Year 3 have also impressed their teacher with their maths skills, where they have been exploring the number 100 and counting all the way to 1000. Year 3 children shared ..

#### Speaking to children about the death of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II

Queen Elizabeth II has died aged 96 after 70 years of service. We can be sad and mourn that she has died but also celebrate her life and know that she will be free from pain and suffering.

#### **Unpacking Emotions**

We can feel many different emotions when somebody dies. There is no right or wrong way to feel. **Invite children to share how they are feeling, do not be afraid to share your own feelings as well.** Sometimes it is easier to describe how an emotion makes our body feel the find the right word for it. A child may not show the same emotional response as an adult, and it is alright if your child does not respond in the way you expect, there may also be a delayed response as children pick up on and mirror the emotions shared by adults around them.

You might want to explain that the country and world will spend time mourning together, this is because many people will feel sad and want to show respect for who the Queen was. We can be emphatic; thinking about how the family and close friends of the Queen must be feeling at this sad time.

We are pleased to inform you that the negotiation of a new contract with our current school meal suppliers, Chartwells, has meant that we are able to reduce the cost of a school dinner to **£2.10** per day (£10.50 a week) from September 2022.

Rockliffe Manor School has its own kitchen and meals are prepared daily by our wonderful chef Gail. There is a choice of meat or vegetarian main dish, salad and dessert with water available throughout meal times. You will find the current menu until October 2022 attached.

#### Free School Meals

Children in years Reception to Year 2 are all entitled to free school meals as part of the universal meal scheme funded by the Government.

Free school meals are available to children from Years 3-6 whose parents are in receipt of eligible benefits including:

- Universal Credit with an annual net earned income of no more than £7,400.
- Child Tax Credit (with no Working Tax Credit) with an annual income of no more than £16,190, as assessed by HMRC.
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999.

If you think you are entitled to Free School Meals, please go to <u>https://www.royalgreenwich.gov.uk/</u> <u>freeschoolmeals</u> if the application is successful, please do let the school know as soon as possible so we may make the necessary arrangements. If you have any problems accessing the online application, please contact the school office.

Finally, please may we remind you, for administrative purposes, that we ask you to make the choice for school dinner or packed lunch on a termly basis and keep the school office informed of any changes.
