Now let's look at what has been happening in the classrooms... Food fortnight has also been very popular in Year 2. The Year 2 children have shown great collaboration when making their Victoria Sponge Cake and they are excited to share their recipe with the rest of the school. Also this week, Year 2 children participated in some art sessions with Art Amy, where they developed their

art skills by creating sculptures. We can't wait to see these on display! It has overall been a busy and exciting week in Key Stage 1.

Sticking with our food theme, Year 4 have also had a great week this week! In preparation for World Cafe, the children focused on how to best 'sell' their product to their target audience. The children designed their posters in their book labelling the important features they wanted to include. They looked at example food posters from retailers and spotted similar patterns such as slogans and lots of pictures. After amazing designs, year 4 set to work to create them using Adobe Express. Despite the children never having used this software before they quickly became more expert than Miss Roper, adding animations and even sound! Isaiah said 'I loved making my poster, I found it really hard at times but I used my growth mindset and kept going!' There are some great examples of these on twitter so please do take a look.





The children in year 4 then went on to actually make their Greek Salads. They worked so hard to ensure they were safe and hygienic, ensuring they washed their hands before they started. Each child was given a different element of the salad to prepare and the children took to the chopping and dicing very quickly! William said 'I love to cook, this is the best day ever!'.

Each group were allowed to add 1 non-traditional Greek salad item into their recipe and loved seeing their creature come together, Anna said 'I can't believe we actually made that!'. Year 4 are very excited for their adults to come and taste their food with Asante saying 'Can I




Have you logged into the Arbor App or Parent Portal yet?

IMPORTANT INFORMATION FROM OXLEAS NHS TRUST REGARDING YOUR CHILD'S NASAL FLU VACCINATION

Dear Parent/Guardian

As part of the National Childhood Vaccination schedule your son/daughter is being offered the nasal flu vaccination. This is being offered routinely to all children in special schools and children in primary and secondary schools in the Royal Borough of Greenwich.

The annual nasal flu vaccination protects your child against flu, which can be an unpleasant illness and in rare cases can sometime cause serious complications. Also, through herd immunity, vaccinated children are less likely to pass the virus on to others, some of whom may be at great risk from flu. The childhood nasal flu vaccination protects against 4 different strains of the flu virus.

The vaccination is given once yearly as a simple spray up each nostril, which is painless, very quick and serious side effects are uncommon.

Legal surname, their date of birth and postcode

If you decide you do not want to vaccinate your child against flu, You Must Decline using the eConsent Form. This will automatically remove your child from the flu programme, and we will not contact you further.

The vaccination session will be held at your child's school on Friday 21st October 2022. Please complete the online consent form by midday on Tuesday 18th October 2022.

If you are not the young person's parent or legal guardian with full parental responsibility you will need to obtain Formal consent from their parent or social worker who can legally consent, along with a legal document stating otherwise.
